## PRAISING GOD THROUGH TESTIMONY

In our last newsletter, we were thrilled to share some of our experiences during our evangelistic meetings in Washington, GA. In this update, we would love to share a conversion experience as written by one of the God sent attendees. It is our prayer that her story (which is still on going with miracles yet today) will be a blessing to each of you.

“Hello, my name is Janean Turman. I’m 36 years old and a mother of 5 beautiful children and a fiancé whose name is John. And this is my testimony.

“At a very young age, I suppose around 8 or 9 years old, I remember how my parents would send us to a Baptist Church. They sent us so they would have time alone. We would go faithfully each Sunday; and eventually, my parents had a change of heart and began to attend with us. However in my youth, I never really understood the meaning of our going to church anyway. And unfortunately, my parents only went for a few short months. Then all of us discontinued to go.

“At the age of 14, a situation occurred that tore my family, as I knew it, completely apart. We were all separated from one another. I was sent to live with my grandparents who were Seventh-Day Adventists. With them, I decided to go to church once again. This time, it was quite a different experience for me. I began to question the different faiths and wonder which was best for me.

“Sadly, problems in life began to get the best of me. I was reunited with my father. He then proclaimed to be a Jehovah’s Witness and felt strongly that I should be too. Now, imagine my religious confusion at an early age of, then, 16. I believed there was a greater power, but I didn’t have a clue who or what it was. I was torn as to which way I should go, or what I should believe.

“A few years later, I ended up letting God go completely. I had lost my family—even lived on the streets for a while. Religion represented total confusion to me. I ended up having a baby while I was very young and had no way of properly caring for her so I lost her to adoption. Everything in my life and mind was out of control and a huge mess. I began to have nothing but hate and frustration for myself, and others around me, including God!

“Even with my poor demeanor, God never

gave up on me as I did Him (at that time anyway). As I look back, I can see how through trials and tribulations God was knocking on my hearts door trying desperately to reveal Himself to me. Though still confused on any concept of God, I recognized His intervention enough that it urged me to pray. I recall praying and asking, “Whatever, or whomever, it is that I need to believe in up there wherever You are, please guide me and someday show me which direction You would have me to go. I only want to understand what is truth, and to be sure I begin to head in the right direction.” With that, I said, ‘Amen.’

“After that heart felt cry of a prayer, I did attend churches here and there, but they never felt quite right. I was even ‘baptized’ a few years ago. (I now realize it wasn’t performed in the Biblical manner of baptizing.) And for a short time, I did my best to be what I thought was being faithful to God. Deep down, it still just never felt like I was on the right track. So still very confused, I decided once again to just give it all up.

“Then in 2008, my children, fiancé, and I moved to Washington, Georgia. Here we could be closer to some of my family members including the grandparents who raised me for a short while. And it wasn’t long before my Grandmother began inviting me back to the Adventist Church. At this point in my life, I simply refused. But I did allow my children to attend. And every Saturday they would return with faces all aglow telling me how very much it would mean to them if I would be there with them. But try as they may, I wasn’t interested.

“November, 2009, almost a year later, here comes my Grandmother asking me if I would attend a few meetings being held for just 2 weeks here in Washington. For whatever reason, I caved in this time and agreed I would attend some of the meetings but only during this two week period. During those two weeks, I met Pastor Kenny Shelton and his wonderful wife, Christine Shelton. I listened with my ears opened as wide as they could be. The words seemed to flow from his mouth so effortlessly. He used the word, ‘truth’ quite often giving Scripture after Scripture for verification. Then, I remembered that prayer I had prayed almost 20 years earlier. I began to question if this was the answer.

Everything he and his wife said just seemed to make so much sense. I could feel something I had never felt before. And it soon became a necessity for me to be there in fear of missing out on something very important. By God’s amazing grace, it became evident that this is where I belong. **I finally felt free, accepted, and hungry for more! Finally, I knew which way to direct my life! God had answered my prayer!**

“As the meetings were drawing to a close, the Sheltons offered everyone a chance, or a once in a lifetime opportunity, to become a child of God. I have to admit—I was one of the reluctant ones to take this next step. But, finally, I decided to be baptized—this time correctly.

“My life as I knew it before December 12, 2009, is completely changed. It’s amazing to me to see how someone’s life can be changed so dramatically. Nor can I truly explain how I feel today. Things of life now just seem to fall into play as necessary. I don’t worry when asking God for help, **I know that whatever my need, I just ask, believe, and receive!** And my children, they are so very happy to have their mother with them each time the Church doors are open. We even do home family devotions. No more just lying around all day depressed. I stay busy continuously teaching my children, going to Church and participating where and when I can, and I now have a never-ending hunger for His Word! Everything is just in sync as it should be.

“I thank Jesus, and the Shelton's, for all they do. I prayer that God will continue to bless them in their work of helping lead others to the Lord as they have done with me and my family. My oldest son and daughter are considering being baptized and my youngest son, along with my fiancé and his two daughters, have recently been baptized! And it is my sincere prayer that my testimony will be of great inspiration to others and that they, too, will have a desire to get to know God in a whole new way”!
